Goal

Write an original, fictional story using the word processing skills and writing activities you worked on in class.

Grading

To receive a grade of 1, your story should:

- be at least one page long, typed, double-spaced*
- have no spelling mistakes
- include at least one picture set in the text
- include a set-up, inciting event, climax, and resolution

Suggestions

Don't forget the other word processor tools you can use, like bold text, different fonts, and tables. Be creative! Maybe your teenage vampire always speaks *like this!*

If you have trouble thinking what should happen next, look at your list of favorites for inspiration. Maybe it's a good time for the space robots to go shopping at Au Park!

This is a big project. One page doesn't sound like a lot of work, but developing and writing a good story that meets the grading requirements can be a lot of work. If you want a good grade, you should expect to work at least 6 hours on this project. You will have some time in class, but you will need to work on your own also.

All material in your stories should be appropriate and respectful. Do not include any pictures or words that you would not be willing to share with Assistant-Director Prostednikova. Do not include any real people as characters in your story.

*I will probably stop reading after ten pages.
